

Guideline For Full Paper Submission

General requirements

- All the oral speakers (including the invited speakers and the selected oral speakers) are requested to submit a full paper limited to 8 pages including the figures and tables. All the full papers will be included in conference proceedings.
- Submit the electronic manuscript both as Microsoft Word 2000 and PDF via email to Prof. Dr Hany: helshemy@yahoo.com by **May 1, 2010**. Faxes are NOT acceptable.
- File name: The file name of your submitted manuscript is suggested to be the presenting author's name. If more than one paper under different topics is submitted by the same author, the numeral should be added as 1, 2, 3, etc.
- The receipt of abstract /paper will be automatically delivered to the e-mail address you have provided. For any further question please do not hesitate to contact helshemy@yahoo.com.
- Papers received after the deadline may not be printed.

Paper Format

Text

- Use 10 point Times New Roman for the paper body with different style at different part of the paper as indicated in each section.
- No indent at the beginning of paragraph, with single spacing and black ink.
- Leave 1 blank line between paragraphs and before new section headings.
- Left justified all figures and tables.
- Fit on one A4 (210 mm * 297 mm) page, with 2.5 cm margins (top, bottom, left, and right), single space, and black ink.

Headings and sections

- Paper title: Centered in font size 12, bold and capitalized. Leave one blank line below the title.
- Authors' names: Centered in 11 point Times New Roman and underline the presenting author's name. The author's first name should be followed by his last name. More than one author from different affiliations should be numbered, superscripted after the author's name. Leave one blank line below the authors' names.
- Authors' affiliation: Centered in 9 point Times New Roman. More than one affiliation should be indicated by numbers, consistent with the superscripts of the author name. Please state the presenting author's e-mail address at the end.
- Section Headings: Use font size of 10 point and bold, left justified, capitalized initials of the

first word, with one blank line above. The headings of the subsection should use 10 point size and italics, with one blank line above. Both the sections and subsections should not be numbered.

- Abstract heading: 10 point, bold.
- Abstract body: 10 point Times New Roman.
- Keywords heading: 10 point, bold.
- Keywords: 10 point Times New Roman. The number of keywords is limited to 5.

■ **Figures**

- Each figure should be numbered consecutively (Figure 1, 2, 3, etc.) with a left justified caption below the figure, and the font used in caption is 10 point size and bold. Please include a blank line above and below the caption.
- Figures should be included in the text, but please do not include the caption as part of the graphic.
- Digital copies of photos should be supplied as high resolution (not less than 600 DPI) and save as JPG and other compatible format of PHOTOSHOP.
- The printed version of the proceedings will be in black and white. Please ensure that all figures remain clear and understandable when reproduced in black and white.

■ **Tables**

- Each table should be numbered (Table 1, 2, 3, etc.) with a left justified caption above the table, and the font used in caption is 10 point and bold Times New Roman.
- All letters and numbers in the table are in 10 point and normal Times New Roman. Please include a blank line above and below the caption.

■ **Equations**

- Equations should be numbered consecutively and flush left, enclosing the numbers in parentheses (x) and flush right. Please do not use automatic numbering.
- Units are standard for the field, and include SI equivalents.

■ **References**

- The references cited in the text should indicate the last name(s) of the author(s) and the year of publication as follows: (Rossi, 2003); (Baker and Kovaliski, 1999); (Zheng et al., 1982; Wang, 1984; Li, 1987); Rossi (2003); Baker and Kovaliski (1999); Keller et al. (2000).
- Please note that when the same author and the same year of publication are cited from more than one source, the sources should be distinguished in the text by adding the lower-case letter "a" to the year of publication of the first source cited, "b" for the second source, and so on, as shown hereafter: Galvez et al. (1997a), Galvez et al. (1997b), Galvez et al. (1997c).
- The sources cited in the text should be listed in alphabetical order of the author's name or of

the lead author.

- Article from a periodical

Name(s) of the author(s), first name initial(s), year of publication, title of article, title of periodical (full name), volume number, issue number, the first and last page numbers. e.g.

Mathew JP, Herbert SJ, Zhang S-H, Rautenkranz AAF and Litchfield GV, 2000. Differential response of soybean yield components to the timing of light enrichment. *Agronomy Journal*, 92 (1): 1156 - 1161

- Paper published in conference proceedings

Name (s) of the author (s), first name initial (s), year of publication, title of article, In: name (s) and initial (s) of the co-ordinator (s), title of the conference, place of publication, publisher of proceeding, first and last page numbers. e.g.

Milthroe FL, 1961. The nature and analysis of competition between plants of different species. In: Milthroe FL (ed.). *Mechanisms in Biological Competition*. Symposia for Society of Experimental Biology No. XV. Cambridge: Cambridge University Press, 330 - 355

- Article from Book

Name (s) of the author (s), first name initial (s), year of publication, title of the book, name of publisher, place of publication, number of pages. e.g.

Tai F-L, 1979. *Compendium of Fungus in China*. Beijing: Science Press, 30 - 36

- Article from Book chapter

Name (s) of the author (s), first name initial (s), year of publication, title of chapter, In: name (s) and initial (s) of the coauthor (s), title of the book, place of publication, name of publisher, first and last page numbers. e.g.

Tanner CB and Sinclair TR, 1983. Efficient water use in crop production: Research or re-search. In: Taylor HM, Jordon WR, and Sinclair TR(eds.). *Limitations to Efficient Water Use in Crop Production*. Madison, Wisconsin: American Society of Agronomy, 1 - 27

- Article from Electronic literatures

Name (s) of the author (s), first name initial (s), year of publication, topic name, website. e.g.
